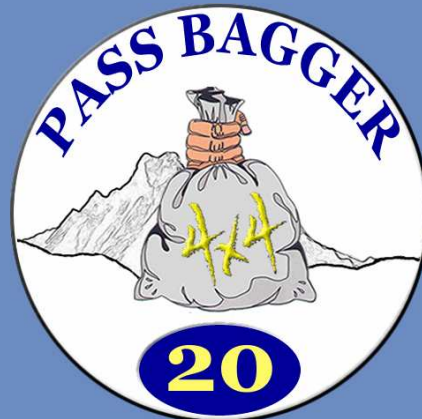
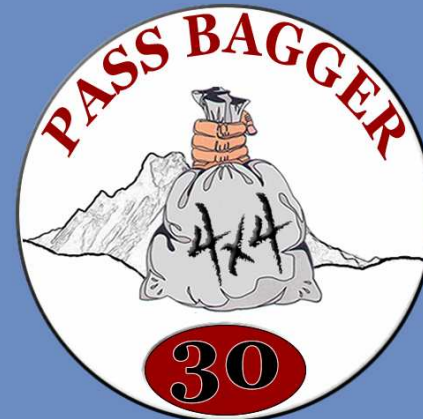

Are you looking for a new way to explore scenic mountain areas throughout the US?

Welcome to the 4x4 Pass Bagger Program!

This program originated in the Colorado BMW Motorcycle Club – they keep track of high mountain passes that they summit – when they reach 50, they get a patch, a hat, and other goodies.

If the pass has is on a map – it's fair game, regardless of the difficulty.

We encourage participants to not attempt terrain beyond their ability.

Quick facts about becoming a 4x4 Pass Bagger:

- ✓ Joining is FREE!
- ✓ Once you join, you can track all of your passes through triptracker.net
 - You can track all sorts of trips through this site, very neat
- ✓ You'll receive a sticker & shirt for your first 10 passes, and another for every 10 passes thereafter (up to 30 passes)
 - Stickers and T-shirt aren't free (unless we get a few sponsors)
- ✓ Only dirt or forest road passes will count, sorry – paved passes are not 4x4 passes.
- ✓ You can download PDF and spreadsheet versions of our tracking & pass info (for Colorado) from the 15ers4x4.com website.
- ✓ All passes bagged must be verified by a picture of you with your vehicle, in front of the pass summit sign (if available). If there is no sign, just a pic of you and your rig will suffice.
 - These pictures can be e-mailed to a Pass Bagger moderator
 - If you wish, you can upload the photos to your triptracker.net site or a photo sharing site (such as flickr), where they can be verified by a moderator.
- ✓ Those passing the 30 Passes Bagged mark will be recognized in the 15ers4x4.com website 'Hall of Fame'
- ✓ Joining the program is easy – just visit 15ers4x4.com & click 'Good Times', then 'Pass Bagger'. Joining is free, but additional costs(s) will apply if you want a sticker or T-shirt.
